

**Mission:** To awaken and connect participants to the beauty of the natural world in the heart of Columbus and inspire environmental stewardship in their daily lives.

#### **SIGNATURE PROGRAMS & IMPACT:**

Chase Conservation Classroom serves 10 schools and 3,500 students in the urban core of Columbus. Designed to reinforce the core curriculum through multiple visits with hands-on learning in science, math, and language arts, its impact can be seen in students who learn better, are calmed in the out-of-doors, and show academic improvement.

Audubon Adventures Camp provides 10 weeks of day camp, each week with a different theme, to children ages 5 to 13. Attendance has grown on an average of 50% each year for the last three years, with many repeat and multiple session campers.

**Lights Out Columbus**, in partnership with the Ohio Bird Conservation Initiative, enlists tall buildings (10 in 2013) in downtown Columbus to turn out their indoor and outdoor lights between midnight and dawn during peak migration seasons in the spring and fall.

**Bird Monitoring/Banding and Invertebrate Sampling**, by citizen science volunteers, is answering the question of whether or not habitat restoration in a very urban setting is truly benefiting birds.

**Volunteers** help the Grange Insurance Audubon Center expand its reach through a wide variety of service opportunities. The volunteer core grew by more than 100% in 2013 alone. More volunteers are always welcome to devote their time and talents in making a difference!

### **SIGNATURE PROGRAMS & IMPACT:**

Columbus Audubon's John Wilson Memorial

**Fund** provides assistance to central Ohio students and residents to attend environmental education programs locally, regionally and even nationally. In the past four years, more than \$5,000 in scholarships have been awarded. The **Conservation Grant program** supports conservation and research projects in central Ohio. In the first year (2013), \$5,000 was awarded.

The Ohio Young Birders Club encourages and empoweres youth conservation leaders ages 12-18 by providing hands-on conservation and monthly field trips. Since 2010, members of the Columbus chapter have completed numerous conservation and service projects.

**EcoWeekend** is held in the Hocking Hills every May and offers dozens of nature adventure programs on topics such as birding, insects, wildflowers, butterflies, trees, astronomy, crafts, hikes and more. For more than 40 years, EcoWeekend has provided education and fun for hundreds of Ohioans of all ages (www.ecoweekend.org).

More than 100 **field trips** and seven **monthly programs** are offered by Columbus Audubon every year to members and nonmembers.
